The Plaths are completely devoted to God and seek his guidance in every moment of their daily lives. Her faith has certainly stood to Plath as she's suffered more than her fair share of hardships. As Woman's Day advises, back in 2008, her 17-month-old son Joshua died in a tragic accident after Plath accidentally hit him with her car while moving fruit trees on their farm. The youngster's death was ultimately ruled an accident, but his parents were shaken by it regardless. Plath recalled how she could barely get out of bed in the morning, but thankfully Barry was unwavering in his support. The matriarch's hatred of alcohol comes from a surprisingly personal place, as she revealed during an episode of Welcome to Plathville that, during college, driving while drunk and waking up not knowing where she was was a typical occurrence for her.
